Hello I am Miss Harrop and I am pleased to be to Computing lead at Brookfield Junior Academy. The ever-growing technological advancements means that our children are growing up in a society with an increasing use of computer and technology devices. It is important that we prepare our children to safely and competently use computers to ensure that they become digitally literate so that they are able to express themselves and develop their ideas through information and computer technology- at a level suitable for the future workplace as active participates in a digital world. A high-quality computing education equips pupils to use creativity to understand and change the world. We believe 'Computational Thinking' is a skill children must be taught if they are able to participate effectively and safely in this digital world.

#### The Three Strands of Computing are:

- Computing Science: pupils are introduced to a wide range of technology, including laptops, iPads, PCs and interactive whiteboards and a range of digital devices such as Micro-bits, Crumbles and Data Loggers, allowing them to continually practise and improve the skills they learn.
- Information Technology: involves identifying where technology in our everyday lives and their purposes.
- Digital Literacy: the skills, knowledge and understanding to be able to participate in an increasing digital world.

At Brookfield, we strive to offer children hands on experience of Computing, using a mixture of plugged and unplugged activities. Computing has deep links with mathematics, science, and design and technology, and provides insights into both natural and artificial systems. We ensure that children are offered experience which involve hands-on, practical learning rooted in debugging and problem solving.
